Finalist for Princeton University's Distinguished Secondary Teaching Award—Ms. Michaud

Earlier this year our very own science teacher, Suzanne Michaud, was nominated for Princeton University's Distinguished Secondary Teaching Award. The rigorous application process involves not only her resume and personal statement of her teaching philosophy and experience, but also letters of support form students, a faculty member and principal. Ms. Michaud has made it into the top ten finalists from public and private schools around New Jersey. As a result, a representative from the program came to HHS and met with students, teachers, administrators and Ms. Michaud herself. The four winners receive an award during Princeton University's Commencement.

Science League

The March 12 meet for the New Jersey Science League for Area 22 was held at Freehold Borough High School. In true Holmdel fashion, we took first place in all categories, Bio1, Bio2, Chem1, Chem2, Phys1 and PhysC. The tests are now much more difficult,

as they contain material that is not normally covered in high schools at this point of the school year. In most of the categories, we won by a very impressive margin!

Moody's Mega Math Challenge:

Both of the HHS Moody's Mega Math Challenge teams performed superbly. Holmdel High School fielded two five-person teams (the maximum allowed) for the 2015 Moody's Mega Math Challenge. On the weekend of February 28th and March 1st, each team gave up a weekend day to write a research paper on a topic supplied in the morning. The paper had to be researched, written, and submitted by the evening of the same day the students received the topic. Our team of Celine Choo, Matt Ferreira, Hannah Lee, Andrew Li, & Laura Lin was a Semi-Finalist, finishing 7th-12th place in the county out of 1,128 papers and earning a Team Prize of \$1,500 in scholarship money. Our second team of Kevin Leung, David Lin, David Ohm, Bilal Shaikh, & Vivian Tsai was one of 53 teams to earn Honorable Mention.

Economics--Fed Challenge

Mr Guastella had five students take part in the Fed Challenge on March 17th in New York City. Four former AP Economics students Joe Blazer, Keven Leung, Jack Chu, Rahul Illango and one current AP Economics student Bill Shaikh took part in Holmdel High School's inaugural attempt. Students were asked to present a rigorous economic report complete with recommendations on future Fed Reserve policy to a panel of New York Fed associates. Our students performed well and enjoyed the experience immensely. They worked extremely hard on their presentation and should be commended for their determination and desire to take on a significant challenge! The team actually produced the exact course of action using the same reasoning and data that the FOMC (The Federal Open Market Committee) came out with the next day.

Chinese Classes

Chinese classes had a Chinese Dinner on March 27th at Crown Palace in Middletown. Forty-five students participated. They learned various names of dishes on the Chinese Menu, and they also tasted them. They had to be able to describe which dishes they liked and didn't and explain why. We also recognized a couple of students who have had an amazing improvement in this semester !!! Some parents joined us for dinner too.

Thirty-three seniors in Ms. Emery's First Aid class become American Heart Association certified in CPR, AED, and first aid!

Broadway Fieldtrip

Students from Acting and Chorus enjoyed a day in New York City focused on the Broadway musical *Kinky Boots*. The day began with a 90 minute workshop where one of the stars of the show taught the students the song and dance from the finale. Students of all abilities and experience participated and performed with enthusiasm. Students also had an opportunity to ask questions of the professional regarding her education, the audition process, and other shows she has performed in. We enjoyed lunch together and made a quick stop at the Hershey and M&M stores before we were seated for the matinee of the show. Everyone reported that they had a wonderful time.

Science Fairs

Ms. Blaha reports that ten of our Honors Advanced Research students attended the **40th Jersey Shore Science Fair**, entering six papers in four categories. Five out of the six HHS entries won ribbons! They competed with over 600 papers presented from 35 schools. Students had to have defend their papers and have an impressive poster. (Mr. Baronowsky provided invaluable help in preparing the laminated color slides for the kids' posters.)



There, **Maya Rukshin won a special award** from the Research Division of Johnson and Johnson, and they company has invited her to present her paper at their headquarters!

Furthermore, Maya Rukshin won **second place in** her division in the **2015 Technology**, **Culture**, **and Society High School Competition sponsored by the NYU Polytechnic School of Engineering**. Maya was the only non-team entry in a field that included high achieving high schools from the tri-state area (NY, NJ and Conn.). This was a multi-tier competition on the use of Big Data in research, culminating in an all day competition in which the students are intensively questioned on the papers the students submitted utilizing big data in their paper. Maya entered her paper: 'The Diagnostic Value of Neutrophil-Lymphocite Ratio in Stroke Recognition'. Her second place win earned her a trophy and a large partial scholarship to NYU.
