- Congratulations to David Lin, whose paper, "Investigating the Application of Cellulose in Biodegradable Flame Retardant Polymer Blends" was chosen 'Best in Advanced Materials Science and Manufacturing' by the United States Army Picatinny Arsenal and ARDEC (US Army Armament Research, Development and Engineering Center). David did this work last summer at Stony Brook University. He investigated the use of modified cellulose as a flame retardant in an effort to move away from the traditional halogenated flame retardants which are highly toxic and will wreak havoc on the ozone layer when released to the atmosphere. He will receive the award from the US Army at a Banquet at the Eatontown Sheraton on March 19.
- Congratulations to Joe Blazer who qualified to take the second examination of the 2015 United States Physics Olympiad. He is one of the 350 students nationwide

(among thousands who competed in the first examination) who has been invited to take the semifinals. From this pool of students will be chosen the top twenty who will compete to be part of the US Physics Team who will be competing in the International Physics Olympiad, held this summer in Mumbai, India.
