- Bilal Shaikh, Anirudh Goyal, Marwa Abdulhai, Yash Shah and Laura Lin will have sequenced clones for publication in the national database, NCBI, the National Center for Biotechnology Information. They are five of ten students in Honors Advanced Research involved in the Waksman Student Scholars Program where we isolate and analyzing segments of the genome from the duckweed, Landoltia punctata, whose genome is at present not completely known. This project is under the auspices of Rutgers University Waksman Institute of Microbiology who provides all the equipment and materials. All ten students are in different stages of sequence analyses and have the opportunity to get published. This is a wonderful accomplishment; after all not many 15-17 year old high school student can claim to be published in a national database.
