She worked over the summer securing volunteers to help her with the task of easing our children back into the school year without too much fuss. She had a three day plan to assist the children in learning the routine that they would use for the entire school year. As the busses began to arrive, Terri marshaled her squad into position to begin the process of disembarking the students. As many parents of kindergarteners stood on the sidewalk, trying to snap pictures of their precious treasures about to begin their educational career at Village school, Terri and her volunteers began the process of guiding the children to their proper destinations. After several minutes of children swarming the sidewalks, following the volunteering parents, like ducklings following their mother, the children were all safely escorted inside of the school.
