

DB: That's right. Bingo is in March, see you then if not B4!


I don't think I get all the PSA E-emails.

Do you have their E-mail address listed as a "safe sender". If not, your E-mail provider may be marking their E-mail as "spam" or blocking it completely.




It's actually an easy problem to correct. Just save the email address PSACommunications@Gmail.com as one of your contacts. You may also have to add it to your "safe sender" list.



A MESSAGE FROM THE HOLMDEL POLICE DEPARTMENT

Volunteers Needed to Assist Victims of Domestic Violence

The Holmdel Police Department in affiliation with 180 Turning Lives Around (180), is seeking additional volunteers to serve on the Domestic Violence Response Team (DVRT). 180's highly-trained Victim Advocates are civilian members of the community who, in collaboration with law enforcement, provide support, options, information, and referrals to victims of domestic violence at the Holmdel police headquarters. The advocates also discuss with victims their legal rights in regard to obtaining a Temporary Restraining Order. The volunteer advocates are trained to help empower victims to make decisions about their own lives. The identities of the DVRT volunteers are kept anonymous. Prior knowledge of domestic violence is not required. Bi-lingual capability is helpful.

Basic requirements for volunteers to apply include that the applicant must be eighteen-years of age or older, have access to transportation, possess a valid driver's license, be willing to serve on an on-call shift basis, participate in an interview process, submit to background investigations and fingerprinting, successfully complete the mandatory 40-hour training, and attend monthly supervisory team meetings.

180 will be conducting DVRT training October 22nd - November 14th, Mondays/Tuesdays/Wednesdays, 6:00p-9:30p, at The Community YMCA in Eatontown. For more information or to obtain an application, please contact Sergeant Michael Pigott, 732-946-9690 ext. 1731 or mpigott@holmdelpolice.org.

The Holmdel Police Department and 180 are partnered in providing this specialized program for *Holmdel* residents and visitors. The services of the Holmdel DVRT are available 24/7 at police headquarters. Holmdel Police and 180 are truly appreciative of the hard work and steadfast dedication of this extraordinary team of compassionate and empathetic volunteers.
