# We are off to a great start in 2013! The staff and students came back refreshed from the holiday vacation and have rolled nicely into a new calendar year. With so many wonderful things ahead of us, we will

The most important item in our minds is always the safety of our students and staff. We have a safety team established at Village School. We have met on different occasions through the year to discuss ways to help keep everyone as safe as possible. As there are decisions moving forward, I will continue to keep our school community updated on any changes that may impact our families. One area to review is our drop-off circle at the main entrance. Please be mindful of the fact that drop-offs begin at 9:00. That is when we have staff inside and/or outside the building to receive our students. It is also important to be mindful of the fact that the drop-off circle is a "drop and go" opportunity. Students should be able to exit cars quickly...curbside. If a child needs assistance with several items that may take some time to get out of the car, please park and walk your child into the school so we don't have a back-up in the drop-off circle. Additionally, cars should not be passing each other in the drop-off circle. That creates a very dangerous situation for everyone. We thank you in advance for your patience in heading out of the circle one by one, in order to keep our students and families as safe as possible.

We are just wrapping up our second marking period, and it is important to remember some helpful hints when it comes to study habits around this time.

<u>Set a time to get rolling after school.</u> It is important for children to establish routines for when they will begin homework. No doubt kids are busy today, but a routine should be established so they are clear on when homework needs to be completed.

- <u>Give them a break.</u> Just as we have lunch, recess, and other opportunities during the day for the kids to relax, it is important they have these opportunities at home as well. Small breaks while working on assignments can give them the endurance they need to get through a night of homework.
- **Plan out a study space with few distractions.** This coincides with setting up a daily routine. There should be a specific area where children can work on their assignments. Those areas should be distraction free (if possible) and should have all necessary materials a child may need to get their homework completed. This will allow them to remain focused, with less need to be up and about looking for items they may need for individual assignments.

Hopefully, these tips become useful tools as we continue through the school year. As the second half of the year becomes more challenging, some planned out strategies will be a benefit for our students' success.

### A Message From Our New Assistant Principal

Hello, Village School! I have been on board since December 10<sup>th</sup>, and am thrilled to be a part of this wonderful community. In that time, I have gotten to know the incredibly dedicated faculty and staff, and have been working very hard to get to know each and every one of the Village School students. I have made a significant dent, and will persevere until the job is done! Please, families, help me get to know you, too, by introducing yourselves whenever you are visiting school. I am eager to get to know those responsible for all of these incredible kids!

Upon entering Village School, one can't help but notice the emphasis placed on character education. Its positive messages decorate the building; students begin each day with explicit character education lessons in their classrooms; the concept of "bucket filling" is common practice throughout the building; opportunities to model respect and problem solving are not overlooked. Village School is a place where good behavior and kindness are valued. To that end, I am pleased to tell you about the good "bee-havior" program we have begun to encourage exemplary behavior during lunch and recess.

There are two components to the program. The first is an individual component, awarded on a daily basis. A student (or students if there is more than one!) is recognized for doing the right thing. That can include walking quietly in the hallway, being helpful to a friend, speaking courteously to others, or working hard on a behavior that is challenging; anything that makes their lunch supervisor (the adult lunch aide in charge of their class) take notice in a positive way. The individual is rewarded with their choice of a Holmdel Hornets pin or a "Good Conduct" sticker. Their exemplary behavior is described to the lunchroom and they receive a big round of applause for their efforts. The second component is a group component, awarded to one outstandingly wonderful class. This award is given on a weekly basis. The selected class is the one that is best able to demonstrate good behavior, as a group, on a consistent basis throughout the week. It is selected by the lunch supervisor who feels, "My class was a pleasure this week!" The winning class is presented with a certificate and a special book-reading visit in their classroom from me!

This program is one of the many ways students are encouraged to make good choices at school. It is my pleasure and privilege to interact with the students in this positive way. I look forward to keeping you informed about this program and others here at Village School throughout the year. Thank you again for sharing your children with us, and don't be a stranger when you see me around – be sure to say hello!

Bus Safety: Reviewing safety procedures our children on the bus.


School Store: Assisting our children with their purchases.





#### Vice President Communications

#### Vice President of Membership

- Recruit volunteers and be responsible for all PSA membership drives.
- Facilitate non-fundraising events.
- Keep updated list of all members and assist VP of Communications with email or contact information.
- Responsible for attendance at every general meeting.
- Facilitates all membership raffles and door prize and raffle at general meetings.

### Corresponding & Recording Secretary

- Take minutes at Executive Board and General Membership meetings.
- Coordinate communication with Appointed Board announcements in advance of the general PSA meetings.
- Solicit volunteers for various Appointed Board events and activities.
- Finalize minutes, obtain necessary approvals, and post minutes in a timely manner.
