

I wish you all a very fun and restful summer break. "Enjoy life, this is not a dress rehearsal."



DK: My favorite movie is "It's a Wondreful Life" and my favorite TV Show is "Criminal Minds"


What are the three things you can't live without (and you can't give any sappy answers like, kids family or love we all know those are your first priorities.)


