

With September in our recent past, I hope you have all settled into comfortable routines with your family and familiarized yourself with all the "need to know" information concerning your child here at school. Always know that your child's teacher and all of us in the office are never more than an email or phone call away to help as any questions arise!

Everywhere you look around Village School, learning abounds! With our focus on STEM and integrating technology as we embrace what it means to be a 21st century learner, our teachers are bringing lessons to life in new and creative ways.

Our character education continues to center on the bucket filling philosophy, and students are engaged in thinking about what it means to be a bucket filler throughout all aspects of the day; on the bus, in our classrooms, and during lunch and recess!

We have implemented a new way to encourage and reward students for their good conduct during lunch and recess. A "mystery bucket filler" is chosen from each class, by each lunch supervisor, each day. How to Upload Pictures to TreeRing:

If you do not have an account, please set one up using the school passcode: 1013778841231103

Once you have logged in, the screen showing will ask you to purchase your yearbook. Do not do this! The PSA will handle the purchase of all yearbooks. Simply click "Skip."

When you have accessed the account, click "4. Add Photos"

In the next screen, labeled PHOTOS you will see individual event folders. To add pictures, please click on the folder you wish to add to first. Do not click on the Add Photos button on the top right.

Once in the event folder, then click "Add Photos," and select where your photos are. Continue to follow the prompts.

TIPS FOR TAKING PHOTOS

- Photos taken on phones are not at a high enough resolution to be included in the yearbook. Please use a point-and-shoot or DSLR for best quality.
- Please upload your photos in a timely manner within 1-2 weeks from the event. The yearbook staff will be completing pages throughout the year and cannot guarantee photos will be included if they are received too late.
- When taking photos, groups of 2-4 children is best. The photos should be close up and capture the spirit of the event.
- When uploading photos, please be aware the upload does take a bit of time. We ask that you try to only upload photos that are clear and bright.
- Please no blurry or dark photos as they can not be used.
