## **Meeting Notes**

### **Opening**

Mr. Schillaci opened the meeting at 9:45AM with the Pledge of Allegiance. Dina D'Ambrosi then directed everyone's attention to the emergency exits.

### <u>Principal's Report – Brian Schillaci</u>
