Opening:

- --Anissa called the meeting to order at 9:35am
- --She welcomed everyone and pointed out the emergency exits and asked that cell phones be silenced.
- --Anissa thanked Linda Jackman, Chimin Hu and Gita Movva for providing the Hospitality Table.

Principal's Report-Mr. Howard:

- --Mr. Howard spoke about the 8th Grade trip to Washington, DC which will be June 3-5, 2015. The itinerary will be similar to past itineraries. However, room assignment forms will be given out later this year to avoid having to make later changes.

- --Students and teachers still have access to Study Island for extra practice in different subjects. Study Island content/questions have been updated to reflect PARCC testing content.

Assistant Principal's Report-Ms. Marino:

- -- There will be 2 new student recognition programs piloted this year at Satz:
- 1. Student of the Month-each team will nominate one student per month (there are five teams); will start this month; the students will be recognized at the monthly PSG meetings.
- 2. 8th Grade Presidential Award-students must maintain 90% or better cumulative average and get 2 recommendations (one academic and one non-academic); the students will be recognized at graduation with a certificate signed by the President of the United States.

Teacher Representative Report-Mrs. Imbro:

- 1. Thank you to all the parents who put together such a beautiful teacher luncheon. We appreciate all the hard work that goes into such a nice event!
