Thank Yous

Second, Suzanne thanked Darlene Kiss and all those who volunteered to hang the **Read Across America** hats in the Village school hallways.

Third, she thanked Terri Ferguson and all those who volunteered for the **Bus Safety Drill** on 1/18/2012. Terri was a little short on volunteers so Suzanne hopes more people will volunteer for the final Bus safety Drill in the spring.

Fourth, Suzanne asked for a big round of applause for Nicole Salzano and Sandra Szilasi for their work on the **Box Tops for Education** contest.

2012/13 PSA Boards

Suzanne stated that we need a nominating committee for next year's PSA board. Specifically, we need two executive board members and three people from the appointed board positions or general membership. If anyone is interested please contact Suzanne Niro.

Suzanne announced that Skate Night would be held on 3/23/2012. It is a family fun night and not a fundraiser.

Vice President Membership/Communications - Lynn Saporito

Lynn began by saying that we picked up 17 new PSA members at Bingo Night. This brings our total to 309.

She also said that we have over 100 fans on Facebook.

Finally she reminded all to use the PSA website, **Holmdelparents.org**.

Vice President Fundraising - Michelle Prager

Michelle opened saying that the school store, to be held 2/23/2012, would be selling Mardi Gras beads for \$1.

Second, she discussed **T&T Tennis**. It will run on Mondays for 8 weeks beginning on 3/19/2012 and ending on 5/21/2012. The cost is \$120 and there is a discount for multiple kids.

Vice President Fundraising - Michelle Sottile

Michelle reported on the calendar raffle held at each of the two Bingo Nights. At the first, the PSA earned \$155 and at the second, the PSA earned \$90.

Appointed Boards/ Darlene Kiss and Board Members

Ana was absent.

Carnival - Dina D'Ambrosi

Dina opened by asking all to save the date for the carnival. It is 5/18/2012.

She then described the carnival for all those who have never attended. She also highlighted some new additions such as a photo booth, face painting, airbrush tattoos, clowns selling balloons etc...

Lastly, she said they would offer incentives to buy game tickets in advance.

Bingo Night - Debbie Brew

Debbie stated that Bingo Night was a tremendous success. On the first night, there were 200 attendees and on the second, there were 235.

Specialized Fundraising/Box tops for Education – Sandra Szilasi

Sandra opened by saying that 32,000 boxtops were received for the **box tops popsicle pajama party contest**. That means that Village will receive a check for \$3,200 by May.

She also noted that 4 classes brought in over 2,000 box tops.

Purvi Shah (Treasurer) chimed in that she recently deposited \$151 received from box top collections in the fall.

Cultural Assemblies – Danielle Curcio

Danielle was not present, however, she texted her report to Darlene Kiss who shared it with the PSA.

On June 7th we will have an assembly with the author/illustrator John Steven Gurney. He is the author and illustrator of *Dinosaur Train* and is the illustrator for the popular series' *Bailey School Kids Mysteries*, and the *A to Z Mysteries*.

Spirit Wear - Darlene Kiss

Darlene displayed the few remaining spirit wear items and encouraged everyone to buy them.

HFEE – Michelle Sottile

Michelle reminded everyone about the **Sands of Time** dinner dance fundraiser to be held on 3/10/2012. She also informed everyone that she is selling 50/50 tickets for this event. If anyone is interested, they can contact her.

HCAA – Tammi Stanziale

Tammi was not present but she forwarded her report to Darlene Kiss. Through Darlene, Tammi thanked everyone who came out to see **Alice in Wonderland**. Second, she said that she is working with the carnival committee to try to get some of the high school kids to volunteer for the carnival. (However, there is a conflict. The junior prom is that night as well.) Third, she said there would be a high school art show 3/15/2012-3/17/2012. Fourth, the high school will be presenting **Once Upon a Mattress** which is geared for an Indian Hill Audience. Information will be forthcoming.

<u>Carnival Date Conflicts – Suzanne Niro</u>

Suzanne continued to share her dissatisfaction with other district functions being scheduled on the date/rain date of the Village Carnival. On May 18th there is the Junior Prom, a half day, and the Indian Hill Spring play. On June 1st (rain date) there is a half day and High School actors' showcase.

Principal's Report - Mr. Schillaci

Mr. Schillaci opened by saying we had a preschool information session two weeks ago. If anyone is interested, check the district website. Similarly, we are holding Kindergarten registration this week.

He then talked briefly about **Study Island**, which currently only impacts the third grade students. He described it as an assessment tool that uses technology. It is computer based and used both at school and at home. In the future, **Study Island** will be utilized by the K-2 students as well. Their respective teachers will be trained in March.

Finally, Mr. Schillaci talked about a Marine who served in Afghanistan. Earlier, students at district schools collected provisions for this marine, who is the son in law of a nurse at Satz. Recently, this marine visited Village. He went class to class in full uniform and entertained questions from the students. The visit was an extraordinary experience and was well received by both students and staff.

Vice Principal's Report – Dr. Ledford

Dr. Ledford began by talking about **Read Across America** which runs from 2/27/2012-3/2/2012. On 2/28/2012, Heroes (military, fire, police, EMT) are coming to read. Each class will be visited by two heroes. On 2/29/2012 the children are encouraged to wear literary character t-shirts or to dress up as their favorite literary characters. (Can you confirm this? I thought she said that we will no longer be doing the character shirts?) And on Friday 3/2/2012, school board members are coming to read and there will be an assembly.

Second, on behalf of the absent teachers representatives (Christine Barbara and Kara Devaney), she thanked those volunteers who hung the "Cat in the Hat" hats in the hallways.

Third, she spoke briefly about NJ PASS. This standardized test impacts second graders and will be given 3/26/2012-3/29/2012. A letter will be going out to parents the following week. She added that NJ PASS is a precursor to NJ ASK (third grade).

Fourth, she talked about **Jump Rope for Heart** which was held on 2/10/2012. This year Village raised \$21,000. She thanked all the physical education teachers and everyone that contributed.

Finally, she shared some staff news:

How to do a visual head check

- · Check clean dry hair in sunlight or bright indoor light
- Inspect small sections of hair 1/4" 2" from the scalp
- Look for tiny unmovable teardrop shaped nits on hair shaft (see below)
- If found treat properly and tell school, friends & family to check
- · Check weekly until college

How to do a combing head check - For a more thorough search

(This is the best way to check if you have a metal micro-grooved nit comb)

- Damp or towel dried hair free of tangles
- Section hair by clipping hair on top of the head leaving 3-4" of hair down in the back of the head at the hape of the neck
- Start combing with the metal micro-grooved nit comb by gently scraping the comb along the scalp and dragging the comb all the way to the end of the hair shaft
- Wipe the comb clean on a white paper towel after every few strokes of the comb
- Inspect paper towel for nits or lice (see below)
- Let the next 3-4" of hair down. Continue combing and wiping the comb on the paper towel
- Complete the combing throughout the head. (takes 10-15 minutes)
- If found treat properly and tell school, friends & family to check
- Check weekly until college

Faces of lice

Lice can live up to 30 days on a host. They lay 3-5 nits at a time, which they do twice a day and they can eat 5-6 times daily. It takes 7-10 days for the nits to hatch. Once hatched, it takes another 7-10 days when they go through 3 stages of nymph before they mature. One male louse fertilizes a female once and she is fertile for life. A louse will lay at least 3 nits right away in a new host. She may survive and lay many nits or die leaving just 3 yiable nits behind. Yery rarely will a louse leave the host unless there is head to head contact or their environment is disturbed, like during treatment.

Prevention tips

- · Wear hair up in braids, gathered ponytails, buns (narrow the target)
- · Never share brushes, hair accessories, hats, helmets, and towels
- · Communicate if you have lice
- Do regular nead checks until your kids go to college
