National Merit Scholars

We congratulate twenty-eight (28) seniors as on their performance in the National Merit Scholarship Competition. The competition is based on students' performance on the PSAT exam last year as juniors. In order to be recognized as a "Commended Student", a student must score among the top 50,000 from among the 1.5 million students who take the PSAT each year. Two (2) of the students are being recognized as "Semifinalists", meaning they scored among the top 16,000 students in the nation. The students will be treated to a bagel breakfast and study break next **Wednesday, Oct. 22nd**, and then will be honored at the BOE meeting later that evening.
