- Back to school packets were done in June this year, which worked out well considering the hurricane and power outage that took place in August. We will make copies again in June and try not to interfere with HS exams.
- Freshman New Student Orientation was rescheduled for Sept 6.
- HHS Teachers Tea is September 21 at 1:50 p.m. The hospitality committee is looking for both food and monetary donations for this event.
- Parents of Seniors Night is September 13 at 7 p.m.
- Parents of Juniors Night is October 4 at 7 p.m.
- Parents of Sophomores Night is October 25 at 7 p.m
- The last BOE meeting was August 7 and there are two more this month on September 14 and 21.
- HHS Library needs new parent volunteers,
- Underclassman picture day is September 23.

<u>**Principal's Report</u>** - Mr Loughran welcomed everyone back by sharing some of his favorite back- to- school ads</u>

- Juvenile Officer Cusick announced that he is retiring at the end of September and will be replaced by Jeff Ackerson. He will handle all juvenile cases in the district and act as a liaison between the school system and the Holmdel Police Department.
- The new HS nurse Mary Carllson was introduced
- The new HS guidance counselor Tracy Morgan was introduced.
- New HS staff members were announced including: Linda Billi – Main office Trevor Cahill- 9th grade English Sean Dowd – 10th and 12th grade English Tara Goldheimer – Special Education Sal Guastella – Social Sciences Claudine Sportelli – Special Education

- The High School Proficiency Assessment scores are in and 97% of HHS seniors passed the Language Arts and Literature section and 94% passed the Mathematics section. All seniors are expected to pass by the end of the year.
- 91% of HHS students earned passing grades on their AP exams. NJ has the highest AP scores in the country with 72% of students passing their exams.
- Thanks to NJEA we were able to upgrade hardware or replace all desktops in the library, staff rooms, and the computer lab in the graphic arts department.
- HHS hopes to take all existing CD projectors in the classroom and place them up in the ceiling.
- HHS gets a face lift with retaining walls and plantings.
- HHS served as a hurricane shelter during Hurricane Irene. Custodial staff worked around the clock with the Red Cross and the Salvation Army to maintain the shelter. Over 500 people used the facility.
- <u>"Turnitin"</u> Software for Academic Integrity is being used by all teachers. Students can upload their paper and print out an originality report. The program deters plagiarism by identifying where the information in each paper comes from.
- The new Bell schedule was presented and can be found on the HS website. School begins at 7:25a.m. and ends at 2:01p.m. Half day schedule will be 7:25a.m. to 12:43p.m. Delayed opening schedule will be 9:25a.m. to 2:01p.m.
- Collaborative Team Teaching Professional Development Programs are set up for staff and will be run by Monmouth University.
- Public Portal reviews are in and very favorable. Timeliness of grade recording was the number one comment from parents. Mr. Loughran communicated this concern to the teachers. If you have a concern with timeliness, school policy is that you contact your teacher first and address that concern with them directly, before moving up the chain of command. The 2nd comment about the portal stressed that teachers need to communicate directly with parents if students are not doing well and that the portal does not take the place of contacting the parent. Teachers are instructed to communicate with parents either through phone or email to address such concerns.
- Staff is analyzing the data from last year and trying to make recommendations about possible changes in the way we weigh and administer mid-term and final-exams. It may be more effective to replace these exams with instruction time.

Vice Principal's Report: - Mr. Katz welcomed everyone back.

- Attendance policy was reviewed. More than 18 unexcused absences in a full year can result in a loss of course credit.
- Students need to be in their first period class by 7:25 a.m. 5 tardies in a semester can result in a conduct report. After 7:30 a.m. all doors will be locked and your student will have to be signed in by the main office.
- If you are picking your child up early please send a note. Your child must bring this to the attendance office and get a pass to leave the building. You do not have to come in to the building to sign them out unless you *forget to send a note*.
- The drug and alcohol policy was reviewed. Any off campus drug or alcohol police charge results in a 60 day suspension from all athletic or extra-curricular

activities. Any student found under the influence of drugs or alcohol on school grounds or a school field trip will be suspended for 5 days.

• The perquisites for the National Honor society were presented and are available on the school website.

2nd Vice Principal's Report – Mr. Bals-

- New legislation on bullying was discussed. You can no longer anonymously report an incidence of bullying. The new policy will be discussed in more detail at the next meeting
- HHS was invited to participate and be a pilot school in a project on ethical decision making sponsored by the Middle States Association of Colleges and Schools. We will be collaborating with several other school in the area including CBA, The Hun School and Hi-Tech H.S.
- HHS has a goal of adding 23 additional sound field systems to the classroom. This will amplify the teachers voice so all students can clearly hear and allow freedom of movement. It also allows for great showing of DVD's and other media in the classroom.
