<u>ARISE</u>

Spoke about Regional Professional Development Academy. School pays a membership for staff to attend workshops offered by this group. The workshops help support our families and staff to utilize professional development. Parents can access information by going to Regional Professional Development Academy
<u>www.lehsd.k12.nj.us/rpda/welcome.html</u>. Run by Little Egg Harbor School District. The academy focuses on the inclusion of moderately to severely disabled students with specific emphasis on specialty areas such as reading as well as behavioral disorders that interfere with optimal learning. The objectives & goals are below;

• To provide collaborative opportunities across district boundaries for effective inclusive educational programs.

- To improve learning outcomes for the non-traditional learners.
- To utilize assistive technology to support learning.

• To increase the number of students with moderate to severe disabilities in general education programs.

The workshops are offered at the Monmouth Mall at different times during the day & evening. The presentation topics include; Autism Spectrum Disorder, Behavior Management(Responses to Misbehavior that Increase Student-Teacher Relations and Encourage Self-Control), Differentiated Instruction (How to Differentiate Instruction to Meet the Common Core Standards for English Language Arts), Retention and Study Skills (Grade K-8), Social Skills, Technology Tools for Learning (Using the iPad for Students with Learning and Organizational Disabilities). All programs target general and disabled children across the curriculum.

BOE

- Currently issues regarding a law suit within the district for \$800,000…cannot give details. Involved past teachers and board members from the past…still waiting to determine the outcome, sensitive issue that the BOE members cannot discuss and actively looking into how to proceed.
- 2013/2014 BOE goals were made and are related to our children…how the BOE can build on. Ad Hoc committees for academic issues…looking at STEM (science, technology, engineering, and math) and how they work together. What are we doing as a district and how we should be teaching our children so when they leave our school district they are prepared. Long Term goals include what we have done in the past, present & future, what the community expects from the BOE. Elections are this Tues. and 3 seats are open, the 3 candidates running are myself, Dennis Pavlik, & Mike Sockol. One year ago we changed the BOE elections form April to the month of November which created a \$30,000 savings to the district. The retirement of Bill Bilecki was accepted at the last BOE meeting and that position is currently being filled by Jodi Chaterum as an interim. She has experience in the position and has done a great job in the past covering for him…currently a process is in place to find a permanent replacement. Nicki Frost IH Librarian is retiring after 25 years in the district…we wish her all the best. BOE will meet only once in Nov and Dec…the next 2 meetings are Nov 20th and Dec 18th.
