Ms. Bandini reports that in **Replacement English** they have been doing many exciting activities based on Howard Gardener's Multiple Intelligence Theory. For example, they are currently reading a play and have acted out sections. They have also rewritten various scenes into modern language. Another activity was recording various scenes from the play and then playing them back for each other. They illustrated scenes from the play using the internet, magazines, and drawings, too. Finally, they are working on a comic strip.

Merck Science Day:

Dr. Blaha reported that at the end of May, HHS participated in the 2012 **Merck Science Day** competitions, one of the most prestigious science competitions in New Jersey, in which about 120 of the best high schools in the state send in their best students to compete in five categories: Biology, Chemistry, Physics, Integrated Science (Bio, Chem and Physics 1) and Advanced Integrated Science (second year Bio Chem and Physics). This year we were able to field complete teams and we won third place in Biology, fourth place in Chemistry, 17th place in Physics, 9th place in Integrated Science and 13th place in Advanced Integrated Science. With our five teams we were able to win fourth place overall in the state of New Jersey. As you can see from this partial list, we are in VERY good company! The top four scorers in each category are the Merck Scholars who were honored at an award ceremony on June 7th. By the way, our two Biology Merck Scholars also happen to be our youngest, having only had Honors Biology!

Computer Science League:

Mr. Lewis reported that six of our top students traveled to West Chester, PA, on Saturday, May 26th, to compete in the national **All-Star Contest of the American Computer Science League**. Our results were very impressive, highlighted by the fact that our Intermediate 3 team placed 3rd in the country. This prestigious contest involves programming and paper-and-pencil test-taking and is attended by the top technology magnet schools in the country (and even internationally). In all, eighty-one teams traveled to the All-Star Contest to compete in five divisions. We sent two 3-person teams who qualified for the contest by virtue of their excellent regular season scores. Five of our six students received individual awards for their strong scores. Our Intermediate 3 team placed 3rd in their division (out of 14 teams). Our Senior 3 team placed 8th in their division (out of 17 teams). These results are truly impressive considering that we are a relatively small public school competing against technology magnet schools from across

the country and the world! Congratulations to all of the students who sacrificed their entire Memorial Day weekend Saturday (5 AM - 8:30 PM) to compete for our school.

World Language Honor Society Inductions:

The five World Language Honor Societies held a joint **induction ceremony** last Wednesday evening. Nearly 100 advanced language students were inducted. Congratulations to all!

AP Spanish:

Ms. Taylor reported about something the AP Spanish students are doing that is pretty cool. They are creating a **digital yearbook** for the AP Spanish class using PowerPoint presentations that **Mr. Baronowski** and she are merging to make into one scrolling slide show with recordings, narrations, and music. All the students had different pages to make with a partner like senior superlatives in Spanish, favorite memories, future aspirations, activities, current events- movies, styles, music etc.--all in Spanish and all about their AP Spanish classmates. Then they made their own personal page with a heartfelt *despedida* (farewell) recorded in Spanish to wish their friends well as they go their separate ways. She hopes this this will be an AP tradition and the presentations get better with the years! Each student will get the entire slide show with all the students work compiled with the supporting media on a CD to keep as an AP Spanish momento.
