### Teacher Representative - Sherryl McBride and Kristin Boca- 2015-11-09 – PTSO Faculty Representative Report

The **HHS Dance Team**, with Lisa Sorg, the new dance teacher and dance team coach, participated in the Making Strides Against Breast Cancer walk Sunday, Oct 18 in Point Pleasant. They raised \$3250! Out of 700 teams, they ranked 36th for contributions raised.

The classroom leg of the **Poetry Out Loud competition** will be completed by mid-December and the school competition is scheduled for January 7th. The Poetry Out Loud Recitation Contest is supported by The National Endowment for the Arts and the Poetry Foundation and U.S. state arts agencies to encourage the nation's youth to learn about great poetry through memorization and recitation. This program helps students master public speaking skills, build self-confidence, and learn about their literary heritage. It uses a pyramid structure that starts at the classroom level. Winners advance to a school-wide competition, then to a regional and/or state competition, and ultimately to the National Finals.

**AP Environmental Science Class performed a day of field research at Sandy Hook and Holmdel Park.** They sampled aquatic and terrestrial plants and animals at both locations and collected data they later used spreadsheets to analyze and examine. The idea was to have students learn how different environmental conditions create different responses in the organisms that live there and has a huge effect on the biodiversity of the area.

The Marine Science classes also went on a field trip to Shark River Inlet in Belmar. Students learned about the unique conditions that create an estuary and how the plants and animals respond to those conditions. The day ended with students collecting fish with seine nets. The fish were brought back and placed in aquariums so students could use them for a later assignment. Over the next couple days students used dichotomous keys to identify the various fish they had collected.

**In Dr. Blaha's Honors Advanced Research course, students are conducting original research.** Projects include:

- converting chopsticks to biofuel using cellulase and yeast fermentation.
- extracting biofuel from used coffee grounds and from used Christmas trees
- purification of water by electrolysis
- purification of water using cilantro
- building a contraption that will not allow a person (teenager) to start a car unless his/her cell phone is disabled
- use of a chemotherapy drug to stabilize brain cells in Alzheimer patients and
- 18 students are involved in the DNA extraction and sequencing of the genome for *Landoltia punctata*; an organism whose genome is unknown.

**Elizabeth Kenny-Foggins attended the International Dyslexia Conference** held in Texas at the end of October. World renown researchers presented on the neuroscience of learning and literacy skills and how they apply to content areas, cognitive impact of processing, attentional challenges and the anxiety in learning for students across the grade levels and into adulthood. She has already begun sharing her newly acquired information with colleagues, parents, and administrators. Her next step is creating a PowerPoint presentation related to the critical need to instruct individuals to write in cursive for increased and enhanced comprehension. Additional discussion in the presentation will include the benefits of manuscript writing for improved spelling and writing composition.

**Italian teacher Elizabeth Malolepszy** just received a \$3000 grant from the Italian American Committee on Education. The money will be used for students enrolled in the Italian AP course, who will benefit from truly excellent online materials.
