Shore Science Fair, where there were approximately 700 entries across the many categories. Nine out of our ten students won, one first place, two second place, two third place, and three honorable mentions.

Two of our students won special awards (as well as monetary awards). Four of our winners: Sneha Sharma, Jenny He, Russell Kamback and Cindy Syren qualified to proceed to the Delaware Valley Science Fair. There, three of them, Cynthia Syren, Jennifer He and Sneha Sharma, won category awards, and many special awards. The special awards range from cash awards, scholarships, certificates, medals and the chance to present their work to professionals in the field. The kids were judged on the quality of their work, how well they know the background of the research, how well they apply any necessary statistics, how innovative their project was, how well they applied the scientific method and how well they presented themselves to the judges.

In another science competition, Junior Russell Kamback placed third in Monmouth County at the open exam of the Chemistry Olympiad.

Students from the Acting, Dance, and Chorus classes attended a workshop and field trip based on the current Broadway production of *Fiddler on the Roof*. During a one hour class led by Sarah Parker, a member of the current Broadway company, students learned a song and dance from the show and performed together with tremendous enthusiasm. Afterwards, there was a half-hour question and answer period where students were able to talk informally to Ms. Parker and explore what it is like to train for, audition, and work on Broadway. The group later shared lunch at the Bubba Gump Shrimp Company before attending the matinee performance of this beautiful show. It was a fantastic experience that was enjoyed by everyone.
