## Executive Reports

#### President:

#### Membership:

- Current membership is at 55% with a total of 400 families contributing to our membership drive thus far. In addition, teacher/staff participation is at 54%.

#### Treasurers Report:

- Membership we have a \$3,800 potential in Holmdel. Last year we received about \$2,200, and we are already at \$2,500.

- The committee is finalizing the assembly date for November. This is a prepaid state assembly a \$1300 free assembly!!!! Our school is eligible for this assembly because we have shown the state that Holmdel is serious about being green.
- Our schools have recycled over 7,000 pieces of trash, raising \$150. The recycling effort is making parents aware of how to pack no trash lunches.
- The committee is looking into water filtration, and using no Styrofoam once a month. Go Green hopes to convert our schools to no Styrofoam by year end.

#### Board of Ed:

- The newest fundraising goal is the rain garden at Village School.
- The Board approved the hiring of a transportation efficiency consultant.
- The Satz School's 8th grade Washington trip relies heavily on teacher volunteers: 22 25 are needed. As of today, we only have 8! This is extremely troubling. We may check with other schools to see if can get more teacher volunteers. The problem is that deposits are due now and are non refundable. Only teachers can chaperone. The field trip could be canceled do to lack of chaperones!!!
- Ms. McGinty said the request for teacher volunteers has been extended district wide.
- A further concern is that if the trip is canceled this year, Satz will probably never get it back. Lucia pointed out that the reaction from parents will be extremely negative if there is no 8th grade class trip this year.
- The Board had a spirited discussion regarding off campus student conduct and disciplinary action taken by the school.
- The next BOE meeting will be held on Wednesday, October 13.

#### HFEE:

- The Holmdel Foundation for Educational Excellence is proud to announce that our fund raising efforts for 2010-2011 will focus on the purchase and installation of Outdoor Classroom Amenities to the newly installed Village School Rain Gardens. A grant from the State of New Jersey funded this initial project. The Rain Gardens recycle storm water run off to create beautiful and environmentally progressive seasonal Rain Gardens along with tremendous learning opportunities for all the children of Village School. - The HFEE's goal is to make the Rain Gardens a fully functional outdoor learning environment for lessons that directly tie into the science curriculum in all grades. An additional \$22,000 is

needed to purchase and install two self-contained learning centers with weatherproof tables, seating and benches in two locations within the Rain Gardens. This will allow all students at Village School to fully utilize the outdoor space in an educational setting.

• We hope to fulfill our 2010/11 fund raising goals through our Annual Giving Campaign beginning October 2010. As soon as this money is raised, it will be gifted so the classroom can be installed asap. It's a wonderful environment rich with opportunity for leaning in all seasons.
