President's Report

- Venture Crew will have an open house tonight at the HS. Alan Rowe from Boy Scouts of America will be available later in the meeting to answer questions about this new unit that PTSO is sponsoring.

- Mary asked Francine Campis to bring the PTSO up to date on the HS cookbook fundraiser.

Report from Officer Bill Cusik

- Bill Cusik explained his role in the school as a police officer with the goal being security and to help administrators meet the needs of the students.
- Officer Cusik spoke of the information sharing between the police department, schools, and neighboring towns.
- Barbara Garrity asked if driving offenses occurring in other towns are reported to Holmdel. Cusik replied that the towns with which there is information sharing does not span the entire state so an offense in Cape May may go unreported.
- Officer Cusik informed us that Kyleigh's Law will go into effect May 10. This new regulation by the state will require provisional drivers to display a removable decal on the car when driving. He touched on issues that may arise like highlighting inexperienced drivers on the road or opening provisional drivers to an additional violation if the decal is removed without the driver's knowledge. State is still working out the details.
- Trenton is also considering changing the time provisional drivers is to be off the road from 12:00 midnight to 11:00 p.m. with a maximum of one other person in the car regardless of relation to the driver.
- Barbara DiNicola asked if an 18 year old student who no longer has GDL restrictions will have violations outside of school reported to the school. The answer is yes. For all students, driving and parking at school is a privilege.
- Final note from Cusik, Chief Wilson is retiring in June.

Principal's Report

- PowerPoint presentation welcoming 8th graders and parents for next year is posted on the HS website. Live presentation on 1/7 went well. 150 attended.
- Swensen in guidance arranged for former students home on break from college to speak to students. The graduates explained the transition to college. Will likely expand this program.
- 78 students were inducted into National Honor Society on 1/14.
- Schedule for mid-terms on website. Open campus on 1/27, 28, 29 & 2/1.
- Any student who is sick and misses mid-term will need a doctor's note in order to make-up.
- "A Day in the Life at Holmdel High School" will be featured in <u>Asbury Park Press</u> at the end of February. Meeting on Feb. 4. Students will write the articles.
- Gifting from the PTSO to the school was discussed with an emphasis on targeting money for LCD projectors connected to teacher's computer for every classroom. Some classrooms have. Not all. Goal is for completion by 2011.
- Barbara Garrity supported Loughran's remarks reminding us that HFEE has made contributions for ceiling mounted projectors in classrooms and needs to see it through as it has a long-lasting and meaningful impact.
- Barbara Day asked for a \$ amount to complete. Loughran will get the info to her.
- HS is partially wireless. Routers have been placed throughout the building. Building design created challenges, but we are almost 100%.

- Dr. Blaha is running a bio-diesel from cooking oil lab for interested students.

Venture Crew Presentation

- Alan Rowe, Twin Lights District Director for Boy Scouts of America gave a follow up presentation to Milton Eng's from last month on Venture Crew, a co-ed offshoot of scouting.
- Venture Crew 10 is a new unit forming in Holmdel and open to area residents age 14-20. Venturing teaches leadership and self-governance through high-adventure activities like rock climbing, skiing, rafting, camping, scuba, archery.
- The youth are in charge of planning the programs with guidance from trained Crew leaders/parents/adults. Cost /youth \$17 which includes insurance.
