Holmdel High School PTSO February 8, 2009 Meeting Minutes

PTSO president, Mary Pomarico called the meeting to order at 9:35 a.m. The PTSO meeting took place in the back section of the HS auditorium. Mary pointed out the fire exists and asked everyone to stand for the Pledge of Allegiance. Mary pointed out that additional copies of the draft minutes were located at the end of the hospitality table.

President's Report

- Mary reported that at President's Council, Superintendent Duncan expressed her desire to reach out to the community as she had when she first joined the district and welcomes private meetings. After spending significant time on the business of the district she feels a need to reconnect with the people.
- Mrs. Duncan will also make a point to attend parents meetings when her schedule allows.
- Mary asked for volunteers for the nominating committee.
- Nominating Committee was selected to help establish the next Executive Board for the PTSO.
- The nominating committee consists of Chris Hazel, Anne Pearl, Anna Li, Francine Campis, and Karin Swan with alternates, Debbie Bohny and Mary Lou Moramarco.
- Mary announced Eric Swenson's presentation.

Principal's Report

- Principal Bill Loughran announced that report cards sent out early in anticipation of snow day.
- A traditional African dance assembly is scheduled for Tues. 2/16.
- Holmdel High is tied for 4th place based on SAT scores in state compared to other normal public schools. List excluded the vocational schools. Holmdel High is first in Monmouth. Source: http://mathacle.blogspot.com/2010/02/2009-rankings-of-new-jersey-high.html
- Thursday, Feb.18th, the Holmdel Township Education Association (HTEA), in association with Central Jersey Blood Bank, sponsoring blood drive at Holmdel High from 7:30 a.m.–2:00 p.m. in the gym.
- Students will need a permission from parents and a complete permission slip to donate.
- "A Day in the Life at Holmdel High School" will be featured in <u>Asbury Park Press</u> on Feb. 25th. 11 students participated writing the articles, taking photos, interviewing, working with APP editors. Finished piece online at www.app.com on 2/24, printed 2/25.
- Added another TV production course, TV Production will satisfy Visual and Performing Arts Credits.
- All 9th graders beginning 2010 must take Financial Literacy and Economics course for 2.5 credits to meet State mandate effective 2010 during freshman year. Course will be given through the Business Ed. Department. Freshman course only.
- Visual Arts will now offer Honors credit for honors credit for advanced courses in Sculpture, Drawing, and Art Studio. Allows students to continue art education and achieve honors credit giving more attention to the art curriculum.
- Senior Option will be available to seniors beginning 2010. Seniors in good academic standing
 can choose 'senior option' as a period one course allowing them to begin their academic day at
 period two. Typically, students have more than enough credits to graduate by end of senior year.
 Selecting senior option would allow these students to use period one to arrive later to school,
 meet with counselors, study, relax, and/or eat. There are many upsides to this stress reducing
 option. It is anticipated that 50% of student would take advantage of the option for their senior
 year.
- For those questioning the 'appearance' of senior option...other Top Ten NJ high schools are
 offering this. Our Guidance Director, Mr. Swenson contacted several leading universities that
 responded positively to Holmdel's Senior Option provided students maintain a rigorous schedule
 during the 6 periods in which they are participating.

- Principal Loughran segued to Jill McCracken's (PTSO Teacher Rep) portion of the meeting with a video from a New York Times Op-ed called, "Advanced Pressure". The video featured educators from top high schools that teach Advanced Placement courses. The educators speak of the enormous pressure placed on students to get into and take AP courses just so they can list it on their transcripts. The educators in the video complained that they are forced to race through material to 'teach to the test' ignoring the point of such classes which was to offer an advanced class for students who had a particular interest in that area of study.
- Great discussion followed. Ideas like limiting number of AP classes for a student to help lessen
 intense pressure. Parents at the meeting were concerned as well, but felt the colleges should
 make the first move with regards to limiting the number of AP classes a student can take in one
 year.
- Barbara Garrity also brought up the fact that school districts beginning after Labor Day shorten the preparation time for AP tests which are given nationally in May. Our students have a three week handicap.

PTSO Teacher Representative

- Jill McCracken responded to the <u>NY Times</u> video by addressing the importance of sleep and the
 lack thereof for many of Holmdel's students just to keep up with the workload. As a teacher of AP
 Psychology, Ms. McCracken pointed out that learning consolidation takes place during REM
 (rapid-eye movement sleep). REM sleep does not occur until <u>after</u> 6 hours of continuous sleep.
- Italian Honor Society having Pasta Dinner on March 4 for UNICEF. \$10-\$12 per adult.
- The National Honor Society fundraiser, Cinderella's Closet at the PNC, raised \$16,000.
- Heroes & Cool Kids training is happening at Vonage. Mentoring skills will be used at Indian Hill.

Presentation from Eric Swenson, Director of Guidance

- Naviance is up and running. Students and parents received a letter and a login card to register to Family Connection, a website to help students plan for their future. About half have registered already.
- Allows students to do create a profile and do a college search online.
- Students will be brought into guidance in small groups to have a Naviance introduction.
