Mary Pomarico called the meeting to order at 9:40 a.m. The PTSO meeting took place in the HS auditorium. Mary pointed out the fire exists and asked everyone to stand for the Pledge of Allegiance.

President's Report

- 'Teacher of the Year' announcements have been made for each of the four schools in the district. Congratulations to the recognized teachers. Holmdel High school - Mr. William Motzenbecker, Satz Middle School - Mr. Steven Tetreault, Indian Hill School -Mr. Michael Welter, Holmdel Village School - Mr. Robert Kreig. Each of the parent groups are contributing \$20 towards plaques for each of the recipients of the award.
- Matt Goetke, Bayshore Educator of the Year, chosen by the Masonic Lodge in Keyport.
- Joe Clores, Monmouth County School Counselor of the Year, chosen by the Monmouth County School Counselors' Association
- The Township Committee (TC) is reviewing the budget to determine if and what additional dollar cuts will be recommended. The TC will also make line item recommendations for cuts for the 2010-2011 school district budget.
- The TC will hold an open meeting on Tuesday, May 18 to discuss the defeated school budget and update the community as to their recommendations.
- Mary urged PTSO members to reach out to the TC and BOE if they have an opinion on the defeated budget.
- There have been letters to the community from HTEA and Central office with regards to the defeated budget. Copies of those letters were available at the meeting.
- Scholarship Committee chosen and they will be meeting soon to make decisions.
- Each parent group in the district will be donating \$100 to the Holmdel Foundation for Education Excellence (HFEE) for a plaque for the language lab.

- A practice level 2 evacuation will take place on Friday, May 21 during period 8.

- HHS Students Score Big in National Merit Scholarship Competition. Fifteen seniors qualified as Finalists in the prestigious National Merit Scholarship Competition. Seven students earned \$2,500 scholarships.
- Holmdel Senior, Dennis Lu, wins Siemens Award and was recently a winner of the 2009-2010 Siemens Award for Advanced Placement, based on his exceptional performance on Math and Science AP exams.
- Holmdel Students Score on the National French Exam. We had 17 students score in the top 20 places of their respective levels.

- The Holmdel Alliance to Prevent Alcoholism & Drug Abuse is an organization composed
 of members of the community, including teachers, parents, administrators, and the
 Holmdel Township Police. Through education, workshops, lectures, and sponsorships of
 drug and alcohol free youth programs, the organization focuses on drug, alcohol, and

violence prevention in Holmdel Township. The Alliance includes the Village, Indian Hill, William R. Satz and High Schools and the non-public schools, St. Benedict's and St. John Vianney. Petrina reiterated the importance are parental awareness with regards to potential drug and alcohol abuse.
