Meeting Notes

Opening

Mr. Schillaci opened the meeting at 9:50AM with the Pledge of Allegiance. Dina D'Ambrosi then directed everyone's attention to the emergency exits.

Dina D'Ambrosi

Dina started out by thanking everyone for coming. She welcomed all the new parents who came out to join us and also said thank you to the parents who returned for the new school year. She told everyone that Village is a wonderful school and she introduced the Teacher Reps, Christine Barbara, school counselor and Kara Devaney, kindergarten teacher. Administration, Brian Schillaci and Jessica Vierschilling. The Executive Board consisting of: Fundraising, Debbie Brew and Lori Umbrino. Herself, Communications, Vincent Daniele. Recording and Corresponding Secretary, Michelle Prager. Membership, Michelle Sottile and Treasurer, Jennifer Ryan. She explained for all the new attendees that the PSA is like the PTA but we are not subject to follow their rules and therefore we are our own entity. It stands for the Parent Teacher Organization. Our goals are: Fundraising and Enhanced Learning opportunities. Over the years we have gifted to the classrooms, sound systems, easels, etc. First and foremost we want to create memorable experiences for families and our children. Second, the staff and parents work together for Village to be as successful as it is. One of the highlights of last year for her was Village Idol and because of hurricane Sandy we all came together and put on a show to raise money. This is what it is all about. She also said that the PSA members will update the parents at our meetings and you will also hear from some outside committees as well. You will be informed all year as to what is going on in the school.

Principal's Report – Brian Schillaci

Mr. Schillaci remarked at how important the PSA is for Village to be as successful as it is. The PSA consists of parent volunteers and we are always needed to make it a successful year. He commented on how successful and how smoothly the first few days of school were and he was so proud of the children. He knows everyone is nervous but it went very well. He thanked the staff and parents. There are over 800 students and 150 staff members. Thanked Katie Evans for organizing the bus service arrival volunteers for the first few days to make sure the kids arrived safely. He is excited for a wonderful school year. He also welcomed all the new comers and our returning parents. The children did not have recess for the first two days so that he and Mrs. Vierschilling could go over the rules and remind everyone of their expectations for the year. He announced that Mrs. Pugielli, Mrs. Varga and Mrs. Antonotti are back from Maternity leave from last year. He also welcomed new staff, Mrs. Prayham, special needs, Mrs. DeYoung/Sussino, 2nd, Mrs. Derso , 3rd, Ms. Murphy, 1st, Dan Frank, Physical Ed., and Rebecca Wadell, new Voyagers Program teacher for the gifted and talented. She was a teacher at Indian

Hill. He also remarked about the Village Idol(show) that the PSA, teachers and students did last year to raise money for an elementary school in Union Beach due to the damage from hurricane Sandy. He said that he, Dina D'Ambrosi, Ms. Devaney and Mrs. Barbara delivered over \$10,000.00 to an elementary school in Union Beach. To see the impact that the school took from the hurricane was an eye opener. They took a tour of the school and it was ready to go for this year. A question from the audience was asked "Is there a way to share the pictures with our children, online? He remarked, "Great question, we will see if we can get our hands on that."

Next week the third graders will go to the office and take over the Pledge of Allegiance every morning.

Safety and Security will be a major focus this year. It will be on going and they will meet on a regular basis with the security division. There is at least one fire drill and one other drill that will be announced. A letter will go home so if you chose you could communicate with your child you can. We want the children and staff to be prepared for first drill after that the rest will be unannounced.

So excited we are off to a great start.

Assistant Principal – Jessica Vierschilling

She welcomed everyone back. Thank you to the volunteers for the arrival of the buses. This was her first time experiencing the first day at Village. She did not come until December. So she will continue to look to the veterans for advice. She was so happy with everything.

Back to School Nights are as follows: Pre-K, Kindergarten and First Grade are this Thursday, September, 12th and Second and Third Grades are Monday, September 16th. Both at 7pm. They are taking place in this Gym/Cafeteria. Then you will go to visit your child's teacher.

She wanted to make everyone aware of the drop off process. Go around the circle if your child is ready please exit the car at the front door. If a child is slow, please do not drive around the stopped car. We don't want anyone to get hurt. Please have patience. Thank you.

Market Day guides went home in the backpacks today 9/10/13. The PSA has earned \$4000.00 from *Market Day* last school year. Delivery will take place next Thursday 9/19/13 from 3pm to 4pm in the cafeteria/gym.

She also explained about our PSA shirts. Look for us in these designed logo shirts at every PSA event. Ladies Night Out is going to be an 80's themed dance party look for information coming up soon for that event. It will be in a bigger venue on Thursday, October 17,2013 at Addison Park. Vice President Fundraising- Lori Umbrino

She spoke about the Kindergarten meet and greet event that will be taking place on Tuesday, September 17, 2013 at Chuck E Cheese on 35 in Middletown at 3-9pm. This event is a way for parents to meet each other. There will be pizza, games, and tokens. In the past we had the parents meet down the hall in the conference room and we found that the only people who were there were the PSA members. Someone commented that this event is taking place on Indian Hill back to school night. It wasn't on the District Calendar when the event was planned Lori remarked.

Vice President Communications – Vincent Daniele

He talked about the October/November Newsletter which includes all the events that are happening at Village and also gives a recap of all the events that passed. He asked if we could get him all of the information before Sept. 20th. He thanked everyone who was timely in getting him the stuff for the back to school packet. Prices range anywhere from 25cents to \$3.00. She remarked that the supply boxes went over very well this year. She thanked Lynn Saporito and Dina D'Ambrosi for helping her. We had over 250 boxes that were ordered. Every year the teachers get together and get a supply list that can be ordered and put in a box. It is delivered before the first day of school and it contains all of the supplies your child needs for the year. There is no waiting on lines and you could enjoy your summer. Your child will not have to come on the first day with supplies in their backpack. She also made mention that Huntington Learning Center would be at our next PSA meeting that will be taking place on October 16, 2013. Suzanne said the deadline for orders will be October 2, 2013. The products are the same as last year. There are sweatshirts and t-shirts. The prices are cheaper than last year and there are samples that you could look at. She brought them so you could see the sizes. You can also order online or from our order form. This year we are carrying magnets as well. Dina told us that the deadline for Toys and Games is this Friday, September 13, 2013. Please put your recycled toys and games in the big box by the front office. The children use these games for indoor recess.
