- Principal spoke about the connection and spirit in the building being tremendous. He thanked the PTSO and the parents who hosted the lunch, which connected and brought staff together.
- New students to HHS are meeting Friday morning, Sept. 20th, for a bagel and welcome. There
 are about 30-31 new transfer students to HHS family

- Teacher representatives for PTSO Sheryl McBride / Laurence Cogger once again
- Sheryl spoke and said anything we need to not hesitate to ask. If there is anything they can do to help communicate ideas or elicit responses from the faculty, please let them know.
- She said the fabulous Welcome Back lunch was "refreshing and wonderful." And that the thoughtfulness and PTSO efforts are much appreciated by the faculty.

Answer: There are vegetarian options every day and most meals can be made vegetarian The lunch website identifies what is vegetarian each day, as well as the website has daily menu

- Based on parent input at the meeting, Lauren said she will look into providing veggie burgers, and other options for both vegetarians and vegans. Lauren added there are garden salads each day, including ones with no meat, cheese or egg. There are a good number of vegetarian students and their parents want more proteins and more options. Again, Lauren will look into expanding these.

1st VP Membership - Alicia Baylock

- Overview; fiscal year ended aug. 31st
- \$11,000 was made
- \$210 went to Battle of Faculty
- \$1600 given to Project Graduation
- \$4000 given in scholarships to seniors
- \$4700 remaining plus \$25,000 is to be given to the high school however, we are waiting until construction is complete to determine what is needed
- Barbara noted we do that donation with faculty input
- We also will ask students what they think the High school may need

BOE

Liaison – Mrs. Liu was the BOE board member who spoke at the meeting

This is her final year of being a board member; she will continue to support school and students

- District Goal; administrator and superintendent suggested these 4 goals;
- 1. Social emotional learning; promote and elevate social interaction; bullying and handle emotions of stress with all the stuff out there; to feel good about themselves

- 2. Homework; we want to make another effort to feel better about homework; will be important issues; put together tests and conflicts; want to help the students
- 3. Holmdel 2020; convenience and safety issues; remind children to be careful
- 4. Communication; 2-way communication; in the past parents have brought concerns to staff and BOE thru PTSO. Please follow chain of contact hierarchy; coach, teacher etc. and do not go straight to BOE.
- Barbara talked about next meeting-Demystifying College; if a parent has been through the process with college applications, decisions, etc. come to this meeting. We want parents who can give help, the inside info.
- This will not be recorded so that parents can speak openly: how to secure the most financial aid; how to deal with sports recruiting etc. Send Barbara your name if you plan to attend at ptsocopresidents@gmail.com
- Debbie Brew: spoke regarding how she runs group of over 600 students for community service in and out of district. She has a plethora of volunteer opportunities for National Honor Society, college applications and/or just to give back. Also, for specific fields; i.e. medical. Parent question; is there a liaison for National Honor Society

Answer: there will be a meeting regarding this very point on Oct. 4th which will provide more info

Pep Band issue was raised. Barbara provided following background;

- Ensemble band kids used to be required to do public performances; including play at football games.
- That requirement was changed with the argument that kids were giving up their personal time.
- The football game requirement was removed from curriculum;
- Numerous seniors spoke to BOE to keep it a requirement.
- Now it is voluntary.

Every parent who spoke on this topic at the meeting were distressed at the loss of the band; the loss of what the band provided for the players/dance team, and what the band brought to the whole atmosphere. Also the falling apart of a true ensemble within a multiple instrument band.

- Heather is working with Athletic dept. to get pep band hats and shirts; this year senior band members will be part of senior celebration game night; getting band members varsity letters was a new adjustment as of last year – to recognize them as the other Friday night participants. The hope is to give band members incentive to voluntarily still choose to come and play at the games.
- One parent explained the band members were not boycotting the game as any sort of protest to anyone at the school, but to the BOE, specifically to make a statement. This parent said kids have been crying and upset by the downward spiral of the band; and that there are only 3 performances now, and no football games.
- Some kids didn't want to use their own instruments in case of weather/rain. It was suggested to put musicians under a protective tent

 Question was asked by a parent; how can a curriculum be changed without parental and/or staff knowledge and input?

Answer: the BOE looked over the issue, and allegedly solicited info from teachers and students, and then made the band's presence optional. Ms. Seeley said they appreciate our input and they are hearing more now, of the upset over what has occurred. They will be "making informed decisions by winter; identifying students who may want to be part of the band without the requirement of playing at games. We don't want to hurt the program. If it was a setback for some students, that was not their intention," Ms. Seeley said.

- Barbara noted this has been a repeated issue in years past; they used to be required to go to all games - home and away - so then the resolution was changed to the requirement was only to play at home games.
- Barbara asked does the PTSO want to take a stand on this issue?
- One lady who was at the BOE meeting where this change was evidently enacted, upon hearing the BOE person say this issue was discussed there, refuted that saying she did not hear one word that the band presence was no longer required.
- The parent pointed out the entire band was there at BOE meetings in May and June begging
 for it be a requirement to preserve this very favorite activity for the kids who are only now
 freshman and sophomores.
- Nothing on BOE meetings' agendas about this issue. So how can we as parents know/ believe that issues were discussed if never mentioned on agenda or minutes?
- Parental articulation that it was a travesty that the kids voiced their opinion for the requirement, and it was still denied by BOE
- It was noted the Band director always allows missed games if needed
- As a parent Barbara spoke of her daughter who said she needs to be at the game this
 weekend vs going away with family because she doesn't want to miss the game. It matters to
 these students.
- Parent pointed out the district does not do a good job of including parents who are to be liaisons. She also expressed feeling that parents are not utilized to get maximum potential out of student/parent perspectives
- Barbara urged us as parents to write the BOE and give our thoughts and concerns
- And/or get to a BOE meeting; the next one is 7pm on Sept. 25th at Indian Hill
- Parental input included if a student does not wish to play at games, then simply don't join the band. And, if every other participant in a club has required practices and performances, they know they better show up. Why is there an exception being made for Pep Band?
